

Goffs Brewery Cheltenham Gold 4.5% abv



The **Goff** family have been brewing in Winchcombe in the Cotswolds for over 20 years. Joust, White Knight and Tournament – the brewery’s regular beers – have become firm favourites with ale drinkers in the area. Black Knight is Goff’s winter porter and was voted silver medallist in CAMRA’s Great British Winter Beer Festival.

Brewed to celebrate the **Cheltenham Gold Cup**, this is their classic American Golden Ale. Boldly hoppy with a distinctly tropical aroma – an absolute winner!



Gloucester Brewery Session IPA 4.5% abv

Brewing in the traditional warehouse location of Gloucester Docks since 2011, this brewery has won a string of awards and **Session IPA** returned to the Taste of Gloucestershire awards and reclaimed the winning spot in the Best Drink category 2017.

Session IPA gives you everything you would want from a classic IPA. It’s clean and refreshing with a nice citrusy finish.

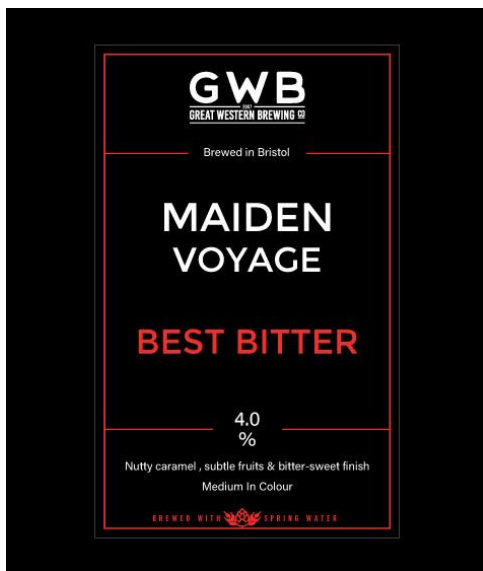


Fierce and Noble I Against IPA 6.5% abv

Fierce & Noble is a brewery in the St Werburghs area of Bristol, just off the M32. Founded in 2017, they describe themselves as committed to brewing modern, seasonal beer.

I Against IPA brings you a kick of tropical and a punch of citrus, with a lovely clean finish.





Great Western Brewery Maiden Voyage 4.0%

Founded in 2007, the **Great Western Brewing Co** is based in Hambrook in Bristol.

Maiden Voyage brings you malt bill creating a nutty-caramel backdrop. The English & German hops add a subtle fruitiness which helps achieve the bitter-sweet finish. A great traditional British Bitter!



Cotswold Brew Co Imperial Pilsner 7.3% abv

We have brought you something truly unique here! **Cotswold Brew Co** have lagered the **Imperial Pilsner**.

The long-maturation gives the beer a huge mouthfeel and a long finish; the German Polaris and Slovenian Wolf hops balance the lager and give it a very East-European influence. Enjoy!



Boat Lane Single Step 5.6% abv

Based in Offenham, Worcestershire, **Boat Lane Brewery** is a hidden gem, preferring to spend their time tinkering with the brewing process rather than that boring marketing stuff. However we tracked them down and sneaked off with some of their beer!

Single Step is a very more-ish pale ale and at 5.6% abv it really must be tried – grab it before it goes!
