



Tintagel Brewery Harbour Special 4.8% abv

Tintagel Brewery is situated up on the hills above Tintagel on Condolden Farm, the highest Farmhouse in Cornwall. Originally set up in an old and redundant milking parlour, the environmentally friendly brewery is now housed in a state of the art, purpose-built facility. Tintagel Brewery use pure water from their own spring, rising 852 feet above the sea at Trebarwith Strand, and their very own wind turbine, to produce a suite of classic real ales.

Harbour Special is their best-selling premium bitter special brew has a dark amber hue an initial malty flavour with a crisp aftertaste.

Stonehenge Ales Great Bustard 4.8% abv



All the brewing magic at **Stonehenge Ales** takes place in the Old Mill at Netheravon. The Old Mill is in the most idyllic setting imaginable on the bends of the River Avon. The Old Mill started life in 1914 as an electricity generator for the Netheravon Airfield using waterpower from the River Avon.


Great Bustard is a dark amber coloured beer with a deep red hue traditionally brewed using only the finest quality of Stonehenge Spring Water, barley, rye, crystal and wheat malts, whole hops and the brewery's own top-fermenting yeast. The complex malt and fruit flavours develop into a very pleasingly fruity and bitter aftertaste which lingers on. This fine beer was first brewed to celebrate the approval in November 2003 for the reintroduction of the Great Bustard bird onto the Salisbury Plain.

Castle Rock Brewery Fruit V2 4.5% abv

Formed in 1977 as 'Tynemill' by former CAMRA Chariman Chris Holmes, **Castle Rock** has gone from strength to strength over the years, developing a reputation for excellent quality real ale.

Fruit v2 is a pale malt and oat base provides the canvas for this refreshing, juicy and well balanced fruit beer. This time, they've used lots of guava, backed up by the fruity tropics of passion fruit and mango. The subtle-sweet malt base with the lactose balances out the slightly tart but juicy and exotic fruit.





Westmalle Abbey Dubbel 7.0% abv

Trappist monks are famous for two things: their legendary vow of silence and really, really strong beer! There are 12 monasteries which are actively brewing beer, most of which are in Belgium and Holland.

Westmalle is one of the oldest and largest abbeys and is based near Antwerp.

In 1865 the monks of Westmalle started brewing a dark Trappist beer in addition to their table beer. They adjusted the recipe in 1926, *doubling* the amounts of raw ingredients to produce a new, stronger beer. The resulting dark red-brown Westmalle **Dubbel** re-ferments in the bottle acquiring its rich and complex taste. You taste amazing touches of malt and fruits with a markedly fresh and bitter finish.



Siren Craft Brew Soundwave 5.6% abv

Siren Craft Brew was born in 2013 with a simple idea in mind: to introduce exciting, full-flavoured and forward-thinking beers to as many people as possible.

Welcome to tropical hop heaven. **Soundwave** is eminently drinkable, full of flavour and subtle with bitterness. Their most famous beer pours with an inviting haze, while big-hitting American hops deliver fruit notes in abundance and a trademark resinous finish.

Lost and Grounded Running with Sceptres 5.2% abv

Lost and Grounded is a brewery on the banks of the River Avon in Bristol, established in July 2016. They say they are fascinated by the precision of German brewing and the idiosyncratic nature of Belgian beers – and are one of the few craft breweries who specialise in pilsners, lagers and other light beers.

A sceptre is something normally reserved for the likes of royalty, but we all carry a sceptre – something that makes us all special. For this Indian Pale Lager they combine Pilsner, Vienna and Caramalts with a huge whack of hops to make what they call a Special Lager Beer.
